

General Tax Information

1. Tax Filing Deadlines

- **Individual Income Tax:** April 15th every year. Extensions may be granted until October 15th.
- **Business Tax:** Quarterly filings due on April 15th, June 15th, September 15th, and January 15th.

2. Tax Identification Numbers (TIN)

- Every taxpayer must have a TIN for filing taxes.
- **How to Apply:** Visit the tax department portal or apply in person at your nearest tax office.

3. Taxpayer Categories

- Individual taxpayers
- Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs)
- Corporations
- Non-profits and charities

4. Tax Rates

- **Individuals:** Progressive tax rates from 10% to 35% depending on income level.
- **Businesses:** Flat rate of 25% on net taxable income.
- **Non-profits:** Exempt from income tax if approved by the tax authority.

- Form 1040: Individual Income Tax Return

Tax Laws and Policies

1. Tax Evasion Penalties

- Failure to file taxes: 5% of unpaid taxes per month, up to 25%.
- Filing false information: Fines up to \$10,000 and potential imprisonment.

2. Tax Relief Programs

- **Deductions**

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- Mortgage interest payments
- Medical expenses exceeding 7.5% of gross income
- Charitable donations

- **Credits**

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- Child Tax Credit: Up to \$2,000 per child.
- Earned Income Tax Credit: For low-to-moderate-income workers.

3. Audit Rights and Obligations

- Taxpayers have the right to appeal audit results.
- Audits must be completed within three years of filing.
- Taxpayers must provide accurate and complete financial records during an audit.

4. Tax Residency Rules

- Residents are taxed on global income.
- Non-residents are taxed only on income earned within the country.

5. VAT and Sales Tax

- **Standard Rate:** 15% on goods and services.
 - **Exemptions:** Basic food items, medicines, and educational services.

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Appointment Booking Guidelines

1. Types of Appointments

- **Audit Appointments:** For businesses or individuals selected for tax audits.
- **Inquiry Appointments:** For clarification on tax laws, filing processes, or disputes.

2. Appointment Requirements

- Provide your TIN or Tax Reference Number.
- Submit a brief description of the issue or inquiry.
- Bring necessary documents (e.g., tax returns, notices).

3. Rescheduling and Cancellations

- Appointments can be rescheduled or canceled up to 24 hours before the scheduled time.
 - Use the chatbot or call the tax office to make changes.
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Taxpayer Rights

1. Right to Information

- Access clear and transparent information about tax laws and procedures.

2. Right to Appeal

- Dispute incorrect tax assessments or penalties.

3. Right to Privacy

- All taxpayer information is confidential and protected under law.

4. Right to Fair Treatment

- Equal application of tax laws without discrimination.
